

Suggestions for comprehensive review of Income-tax Act

In order to make the Income Tax Act concise, clear, and easy to understand, the Finance Minister, in her Budget 2024-25 Speech, announced a comprehensive review of the IT Act. The CBDT has launched a web page inviting public suggestions on simplifying the language, reducing litigation and compliance burden, and removing redundant and obsolete provisions. The web page is live and accessible to the public on the e-filing portal,
